Entry The enclosed registration form and a copy of each dog's pedigree must be send to Dansk Kennel Klub at the lastest by 13 October 2010.

There will be a international competition on Friday and Saturday. Friday evening at 18.00 O'clock for Agility class 3.

Saturday Agility class 1 – Agility class 3 – Agility class 2 – Jump class 3 – Jump class 1 and Jump class 2 (in this order).

Judge: Joao Sa (Portugal) and Hans Peter Dinesen (Denmark).

Hotel We have pre-booked rooms for the national teams at Herløv Hotel, Herlev Torv 9-11, 2730 Herlev. The teams book their hotel rooms via Dansk Kennel Klub by completing the enclosed form. Reservations must be made **no later than 13 October 2010**.

The hotel is located about 5 kilometer from the hall. About 15 minutes in car.

Price: Doubleroom 750,- dkk. per night – included breakfast and dog.

Training The teams from each country will be offered an opportunity to train at the competition Venue on Sunday morning from 08.20 to 09.30.

Dinner Dansk Kennel Klub will host a dinner for the teams and teams leaders at the Herløv Hotel on Saturday evening about 19.00. Travel companions are invited to attend the dinner at their own expense. Notification is done via the attached form, by 13 October 2010.

Special information

All the Participants must have a veterinarian check on Saturday midday and Participants from the above countries can consult the veterinarian for worm treatment and the required paperwork for the dogs involved. The dog owner must pay a fee of **DKK 250.00** (exclusive of pills) for the consultation.

Vaccination:

According to the vaccination regulations a dog must have a vaccination against distemper and parvovirus. The vaccination must be made at least 14 days before the trial. For dogs under 24 months the vaccination must not be more than 1 year old. For dogs over 24 months the vaccination must not be more than 4 years old. Dogs from abroad must have a valid rabies vaccination that has been given at least 21 days prior to departure.

Cropping and docking****Ear cropping**

All ear cropped dogs born after 30 June 2009 cannot be shown regardless of the dog's country of birth. Cropped dogs born before 1 July 2009 can only be shown if the dog has been born in a country where ear cropping is permitted. (Danish bred ear cropped dogs born after 1 January 1985 cannot be shown). It may be possible to procure further information at the show secretariat regarding the state of affairs of ear cropping in other FCI countries.

Tail docking

Tail docked dogs born after 1 June 1996 cannot be shown, regardless of the dog's country of birth. The prohibition also includes dogs that have been docked for veterinary reasons, irrespective of whether a veterinary certificate is presented. The following breeds are excepted from the tail docking prohibition: *Brittany spaniel, German shorthaired pointer, German wirehaired pointer, Vizsla and Weimaraner.*

If a dog has been *born* stump-tailed (with a natural bobtail) it must as far as *Danish bred dogs* are concerned appear from the dog's pedigree certificate. As far as *foreign-bred dogs* are concerned, a veterinary certificate *issued in English* in the country where the dog has been bred must be presented, certifying that the dog has been *born* stump-tailed.

For dogs born after 1 October 2004, only the following breeds can have inserted in the pedigree certificate that the dog has been born stump-tailed (with a natural bobtail): Australian shepherd, Australian Stumpy Tail Cattle Dog, Boston terrier, Bourbonnais pointing dog, Bouvier des Flandres, Croatian sheepdog, Danish/Swedish farm dog, English bulldog, Entlebucher sennenhund, French bulldog, Gos d'Atura catala, Jack Russell terrier, Karelian bear dog, King Charles spaniel, Mudi, Old English sheepdog, Perro de agua espanol, Polski Owczarek niziny,

Pyrenean shepherd dog, Pyrenean sheepdog (smooth faced), Swedish vallhund (Västgötaskets), Schipperke, Terrier Brasileiro, Welsh corgi Pembroke.

Dogs without tail or with only a part of the tail born after 1 October 2004 of all other breeds than the above (and of course Brittany spaniel, German shorthaired pointer, German wirehaired pointer, Vizsla and Weimaraner which are excepted from the docking prohibition) are considered missing a part of the body and consequently they cannot be shown (must be disqualified).

Furthermore, according to Danish legislation removal of dewclaws with the purpose of changing the dog's appearance is forbidden.
